1. Bring to class
 1. **Textbook:** Roszak Stanisław, Kłaczek Jarosław, *Poznać przeszłość. Wiek XX. Podręcznik do historii dla szkół ponadgimnazjalnych*, Warszawa 2014 (Nowa Era)
 2. **Notebook:** size of your choice
 3. **Knowing:** what happened last time, both in class and in the textbook
 4. **Homework:** which has to be full – all given exercises, pages to read etc.
2. Grades
 1. You can be unprepared **thrice** a semester. Reasons for being unprepared do not matter. Any special circumstances must be given and negotiated **before class**.
 2. **Major tests:** three times a year (Interwar; Second World War; World after WW2). The mark contributes to final average as three short tests. You can improve your mark once. The second mark always matters („Try not” - Master Yoda).
 3. **Short tests:** every 2-4 lessons. You cannot correct your mark and do not need to write them if you miss them.
 4. **Classwork:** be active. Ask questions. Avoid doing stupid stuff. You may be given a positive or negative grade for your work.
 5. **Homeworks:** essays, worksheets, maps. Some will be collected to be marked. Gather them – I may ask you to show me your yearly work if you would like to correct your final grade.
3. Be independent
 1. **Schedule:** meet the deadlines and check the schedule.
 2. **Plagiarism equals stealing** and will be treated as such. If you want to quote someone – use quotation marks. If you paraphrase someone – make it clear that you do. If you use a picture taken from internet – sign it correctly.
